BFQ are determined to focus on contemporary music, with an emphasis on Romanian music, where composers like Doina Rotaru and Gabriel Mălăncioiu write pieces devoted to the flute, as an instrument of extraordinary potential for nuances and technical excellence. The members would like part of the quartet's future identity to consist in pieces written especially for them, showcasing the artistry and expressive capacity of the group. This field knows no limits, and the flute can easily turn from an instrument of ethereal sound into one igniting fiery, warlike attitudes.

Whether they will only perform academic music together or they will also approach a repertoire addressing the general public, professionalism will always come first for Carla, Elena, Lorena and Mihai. BFQ is a group with modern aesthetics, and its mentor lon Bogdan Ştefănescu supports this philosophy based on intense cooperation at emotional level and on the complementarity of the personalities of its members.



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
